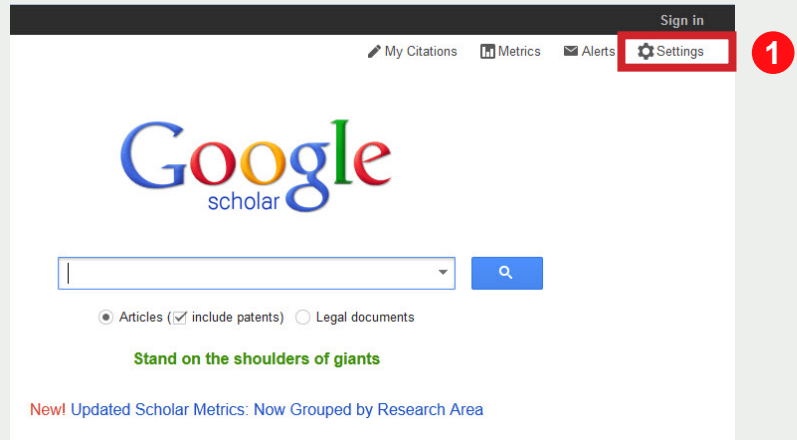


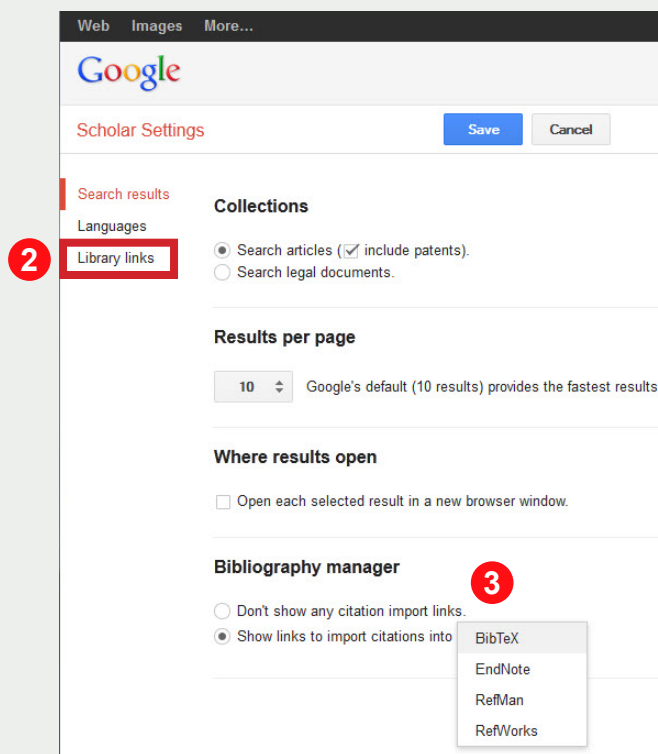
You don't need a Google account to set your preferences for a single session. If you are logged into your Google account, your **Scholar Settings** will be saved.

1 Click on **Settings**.

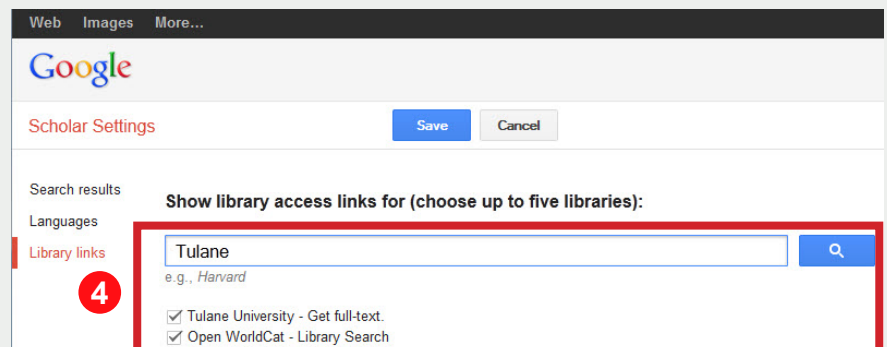


2 From the **Scholar Settings** page, click on **Library Links**.

3 Also, RefWorks and EndNote users can set a link to import citations from Google Scholar. Be sure to click **Save**.



4 Type *Tulane* in search box to set up a connection to TU Link. **Check the box** next to Tulane to select it. For articles that aren't already online, this setting will add a feature to search for full-text using TU Link using the **Get full-text** link the right of the result.
