

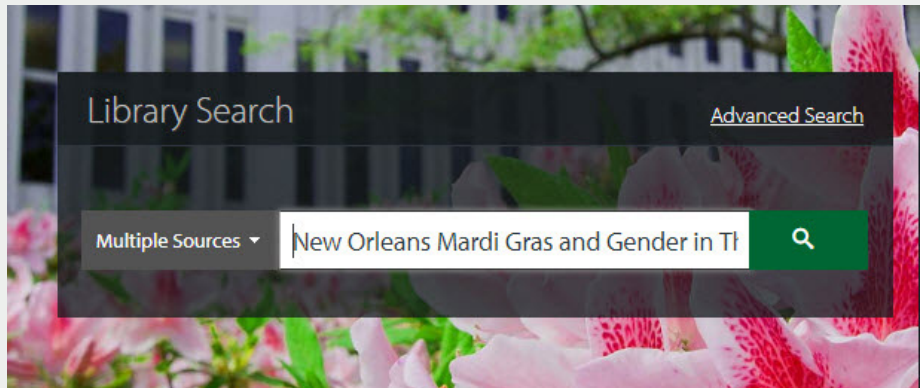
Let's say you want to read this article that is available through Howard-Tilton Library:

Go to the library website at library.tulane.edu.

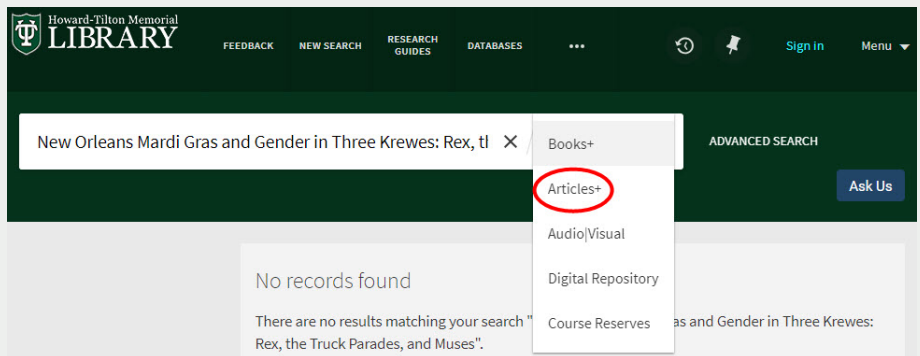
From there, you can **search** for the article, by **article title**.

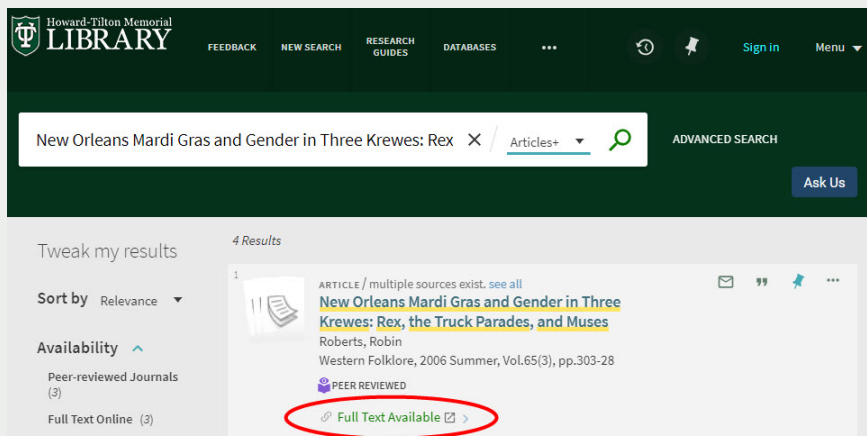
The results page has several types of result lists, including books, articles, audio visual.

Click on **Articles+** in the drop down menu to get a list of articles.



Find the article in the list.

Click on **Full Text Available** to connect to the full text of the article.



Click on **Full Text Online** to get full text.
